

1. Please make sure that a point slip sheet is accurately and legibly filled out for each box of items your scholar is turning in. Please PRINT clearly so that the volunteers can read the numbers and letters written on each point slip sheet. Keep a copy of each point slip sheet for your own records.
2. Please do not tape the point slip sheet to the box. Place the point slip sheet inside the box on top of all the items so that each item can be verified later for its specific point value. We are pleading for honesty and accuracy on the part of parents and scholars. Character counts here at Haas Hall Academy!
3. Use good judgment when placing the items in the box. Is this item in good enough condition for someone out in the community to pay some money for it? We are looking for items that have resale value, not just items that can give your scholar a lot of points. Please be thoughtful about the items being donated. We had to throw out many items last year that had some mold, water damage, missing pages, and excessive handwriting and other random markings on them. Remember these items represent Haas Hall Academy to the community. Please send in nothing that can be considered risqué by the general public.
4. Please don't send in magazines, pamphlets, Reader's Digest Condensed books, and encyclopedia sets. THEY DON'T SELL and they create a huge amount of work for our small volunteer group to go through.
5. If you are donating used textbooks: We can only accept textbooks that were published from the year 2000 until now. We had too many dated textbooks from the 1960's, 70's, 80's and 90's that just don't have a market in this area. However any textbooks from the 1950's or earlier have nostalgic and sentimental value and are sought as interesting collector items.
6. All Homeschooling curriculum from any date is welcomed. There are numerous customers who will come to the Book Fair just for quality homeschool books and workbooks as well as children's literature and picture books. We will be advertising to day care centers and church nurseries to come and look for good books to supply for their children this year. If you or someone else has outgrown these items, please donate them! There are many, many children in our community who need and will use these items.
7. If you could wipe off any dust on the items before placing them in the boxes, that will save our volunteers a lot of time. Erasing any stray pencil marks and cleaning off plastic covers would greatly be appreciated. We are establishing a reputation in the community for academic excellence and it starts with the appearance and usefulness of our donated items.
8. Empty boxes are needed and will count for points on the point slip sheets if they are usable.
